### Rising up to support her family - Sara's story



After working in manufacturing for three years without a salary increase, Sara Ndayisaba, a foreign-born citizen and mom of four children, needed a change. "I didn't know where to start. I needed something that would support us financially, help us buy a home, and fit in with our schedule," Sarah explained.

Sara's friend told her about PA Women Work's RISE program - a service that helps refugees and immigrants navigate the American workforce and achieve financial stability. She was connected to Kristen Tsapis, RISE program manager.

"I wanted to apply for UPMC's Environmental Services training program, but I couldn't finish it on my own," Sarah explained. "Kristen sat down with me for three hours and walked me through it. It was so helpful."

A few weeks later, Sara was accepted into the program. While the program was paid, Sara decided to continue working her full-time manufacturing job throughout the training. "I was working so hard. I went from the training, straight to work. At the end of the program, I felt so happy," Sara said. "The training ended on a Friday, and I began my new job at UPMC Mercy on Monday."

Sara started her new job in February 2020, and after a year, she and her husband had enough money to buy a house for their family. "I continued to be in touch with Kristen, and when we were moving and didn't yet have Internet set up, Kristen helped me get my kids registered for school," Sara said.

With plans to build her own career as her children get older, Sara continues to spread the word about the RISE program to her friends, family and neighbors. "I send everyone to PA Women Work who needs help. Kristen is a good person - she is such a helper," Sarah insisted. "I owe PA Women Work so much for helping me get to where I am today."

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### Donor spotlight: Lori Heiles

When Lori Heiles reminisces about her godmother her conversation is peppered with deep admiration and anecdotes that bring both laughter and tears. Her godmother, Pamela Walker, affectionately known to Lori as "Aunt Pam," passed away this February leaving behind the legacy of a trailblazing career woman who devoted herself to family, friends and colleagues.

Aunt Pam grew up in New Kensington, heading straight into the workforce at age 18 to support herself and her family. She started as a retail bank teller and retired as the vice president of risk management for BNY Mellon - a testament to her career drive.

"I think as a woman building a career in the 80s, she knew she had to work twice as hard to get ahead, but she always made time for the people in her life," recalled Lori. "Back then, it was challenging for women to advance in the workforce, and when they did, it was common to shut the door behind them. But, as Pam's career advanced, she brought so many women up the ladder with her. She retired with some of the same colleagues she started out with."

Lori always looked up to Aunt Pam and admired her career and work ethic. When Lori's own career started taking off, Aunt Pam proved to be her strongest cheerleader, providing advice and mentorship as she made important work and life decisions.

When Pam passed away, Lori wanted to do something meaningful in her honor by directing gifts in her memory to an organization that aligned with what she remembered best about her godmother. "PA Women Work, and especially the 3 Cups of Coffee mentorship program, was a perfect fit. Aunt Pam was a mentor to so many women."
